



## **Government of the District of Columbia Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4B**

### **RESOLUTION #4B-21-0203**

**Requesting Traffic Calming Within Single Member District 4B04  
Adopted February 22, 2021**

Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4B takes note of the following:

- Commissioner Brenda Parks, ANC 4B04, has received numerous complaints regarding speeding and reckless driving along the 6000 block of 7th Street, NW, between Peabody Street, NW, and Quackenbos Street, NW. The area includes a downhill slope along the road, which encourages drivers to pick up speed.
- Commissioner Brenda Parks, ANC 4B04, has received numerous requests from neighbors to install speed humps along the 6000 block of 7th Street, NW, between Peabody Street, NW, and Quackenbos Street, NW.
- The affected area is residential, including children and seniors, who are more vulnerable to traffic injuries and fatalities. Capital City Public Charter School and the Metrobus lines that travel along 5th Street, NW, are located in close proximity. In addition, the Takoma Aquatic Center, playground, and fields, as well as the forthcoming Takoma dog park, several additional schools, several daycares, and the Takoma Metro are all within approximately one mile.
- A representative from the District Department of Transportation informed Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4B at a meeting on July 21, 2020, that requests for speed humps must be submitted via a Commission Resolution, and not the Department's Traffic Safety Assessment process.

#### **RESOLVED:**

- That Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4B recognizes broad community support for speed humps along the 6000 block of 7th Street, NW, between Peabody Street, NW, and Quackenbos Street, NW, and calls on the District Department of Transportation to promptly install speed humps along this street.

**FURTHER RESOLVED:**

That the Commission designates Commissioner Brenda Parks, ANC 4B04, to represent the Commission in all matters relating to this Resolution.

**FURTHER RESOLVED:**

That, in the event the designated representative Commissioner cannot carry out their representative duties for any reason, the Commission authorizes the Chair to designate another Commissioner to represent the Commission in all matter relating to this Resolution.

**FURTHER RESOLVED:**

That, consistent with DC Code § 1-309, only actions of the full Commission voting in a properly noticed public meeting have standing and carry great weight. The actions, positions, and opinions of individual commissioners, insofar as they may be contradictory to or otherwise inconsistent with the expressed position of the full Commission in a properly adopted resolution or letter, have no standing and cannot be considered as in any way associated with the Commission.
