RESOLUTION #4B-25-0302

**Calling On the DC Department of Public Works To
Enforce ROSA Violations For Vehicles With Temporary
Tags**

Adopted March 24, 2025

Advisory Neighborhood Commission 4B (Commission) takes note of the following:

- The Registration of Out-of-State Automobiles (ROSA) Program is designed to ensure that vehicles regularly parked in the District of Columbia comply with local registration and parking requirements.
- The DC Department of Public Works (DPW) is responsible for enforcing ROSA violations, which help maintain parking availability for residents and ensure compliance with District vehicle registration laws.
- An increasing number of vehicles with temporary license plates are parked long-term in ANC 4B, often evading ROSA enforcement, avoiding registration fees, and skirting accountability for traffic and parking violations.
- The lack of enforcement against vehicles with temporary tags undermines the purpose of ROSA regulations and leads to potential abuses of temporary registrations from other jurisdictions.

RESOLVED:

- ANC 4B urges DPW to enforce ROSA regulations on vehicles with temporary tags, ensuring that long-term parked vehicles are properly registered in the District.
- The Commission requests increased DPW enforcement patrols in neighborhoods experiencing a high volume of out-of-state and temporary-tagged vehicles parked beyond the legal limit.

- ANC 4B calls on the DC Council to clarify and strengthen ROSA enforcement rules, ensuring that vehicles with temporary plates cannot evade registration and parking regulations.
- The Commission requests a quarterly report from DPW on current ROSA enforcement efforts within the boundaries of ANC 4B, including actions taken against vehicles with temporary tags, beginning March 1, 2025.

FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Commission designates Commissioner Tiffani Nichole Johnson, ANC 4B06, to represent the Commission in all matters relating to this Resolution.

FURTHER RESOLVED:

That, in the event the designated representative Commissioner cannot carry out their representative duties for any reason, the Commission authorizes the Chair to designate another Commissioner to represent the Commission in all matters relating to this Resolution.

FURTHER RESOLVED:

That, consistent with DC Code § 1-309, only actions of the full Commission voting in a properly noticed public meeting have standing and carry great weight. The actions, positions, and opinions of individual commissioners, insofar as they may be contradictory to or otherwise inconsistent with the expressed position of the full Commission in a properly adopted resolution or letter, have no standing and cannot be considered in any way associated with the Commission.
